It's hard to believe we're in the fourth quarter of 2011 already! We look forward to the reduced humidity and cooler temperatures but not nearly as much as we look forward to welcoming back all those members who traveled north for the summer. Upon their return to the Gulf Harbors Yacht Club they will notice a few changes implemented since their last visit, some of which were detailed in my last report to you here in The Soundings.

One of the most obvious and important change will be the sounds of demolition and construction that will soon emanate from our docks as the long awaited refurbishment project takes effect. As of this writing (September 25), we expect to close on our new mortgage with TD Bank within the next week. At that time, we will retire our commercial note with SunTrust. We have already secured the necessary permitting from Pasco County and the Woodlands Association and can therefore begin the docks project almost immediately.

So, it won't be long until our new, north floating dock is under construction to be followed immediately by the phased demolition of our existing finger docks and the construction of their replacements. At the same time, we will follow up with the Dan

Wright Corporation to begin the installation of a new exhaust hood system for the kitchen, a new dishwasher exhaust fan as well as a new, 3 phase cooling system for the kitchen.

The Bridge and Board appreciate your patience as it took nearly three months' time to secure the necessary financing. However, we believe the wait was worth it and we will soon see some excellent results.

During our refinancing discussions with TD Bank, we were acquainted with their Affinity Membership Program. We learned that it provides an opportunity to help raise money for our Club. TD Bank will make an annual contribution to GHYC, based upon the average balance in our members' eligible accounts, including checking, savings, money market, certificates of deposit and/or retirement accounts. Representatives of TD Bank attended our most recent General Meeting to explain this program in detail. Anyone interested in additional information is asked to speak with any of the Bridge Officers.

Our thanks to Glenn Alber who has again agreed to Chair this year's Scholarship Fund Golf Tournament and to Bob Wells who has offered to serve as Co-Chair, as well as to Dick Bourbonais and Les Jockers who volunteered to be members of this committee. The tournament will take place on Saturday, October 22 at Timber Greens Golf Course with a tee time of 11:00 AM. After the tournament, the Lounge will open at 4:30 PM with a buffet dinner to follow at 6:00 PM. Non golfers are more than welcome to attend the dinner at a cost of \$20 per person. Hole sponsorships are set at \$100 this year, but several individuals or couples may sponsor the same hole and share the cost.

Sign-up sheets for the tournament and hole sponsors are in the Lounge. Golfers are encouraged to form their own foursomes. If anyone signs up as a single, they will be assigned to a team. Outside guests are also welcome to play and participate in the dinner. Solicitation letters have been completed. While the committee will soon be distributing these to local area businesses for raffle items, they have asked for assistance in contacting local businesses. The committee is also looking for donated items for both the raffle and/or the auction. Donated items may be given to any member of this committee.

Our By Laws, specifically, ARTICLE VII – COMMITTEES, call for the appointment of a Nominating Committee. I am happy to tell you that Past Commodore John Lemon has agreed to serve as Chair, along with Past Commodore Jim Shuman, Bonnie Hecock, Mary Jo Langie and Frank Hermann. This committee is charged with an important assignment in presenting a slate of qualified candidates for the Bridge and Board for next year. Candidates will be presented to the membership at our November General Meeting.

We recently reapplied for our Bingo License effective October 1 of this year through September 30 of next year. I am happy to tell you that our license was granted. As part of our renewal process, we were required to submit unaudited financial results to the Pasco County Board of County Commissioners. From last October through August of this year we recorded a profit of \$796.43 on Bingo and a profit of \$2,603.97 on Instant Bingo (pull tabs). That totals \$3,400.40 which has been posted to our operating account on an ongoing basis. The Board has agreed to my suggestion to make a contribution to our Scholarship Fund equating to 10% of those profits or \$340. We want to thank eve-

ryone who supports this effort by purchasing pull tabs and/or participating in our monthly Bingo games.

Our Annual Membership Drive will take place this month and will be highlighted by our Open House scheduled for Sunday, October 16 from 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM. This is the same date as the IOBG Pig Roast and I wish to thank the IOBG for their willingness to let us share the event with them. Guests are invited for a free drink and may also attend the Pig Roast if they wish at the regular ticket price of \$25.00. Tickets are available from any past commodore. We will again offer a discounted initiation fee of \$100 per person with the proviso that prospective members pre pay their 2012 dues. In doing so, they will get a portion of October as well as the months of November and December for free.

During our meeting of August 8, the Board approved three amendments to the By Laws. Two of them deal with electronic voting and the final concerns an increase in the dollar amount the Board is authorized to spend and also permits us to engage in electronic bill pay. These amendments were presented to the membership at our most recent General Meeting and also appear elsewhere in this issue for your review. They will be voted upon by the membership in October.

Finally, at our meeting of September 12, the Board decided to again keep the 2012 dues at the current level. This means that our dues will not have been increased for four consecutive years! The caveat is that we are now required to collect sales tax on the dues, which at the 7% rate, comes to an additional \$31.50 per person or \$63.00 per couple.

My thanks to all the members of the Bridge and Board for their valued assistance in keeping the Club operating efficiently, I also wish to thank all of our members for their encouragement and support and for helping to make our Club such a great place to visit. It seems we really are “Home to the Friendliest People in Florida.”

**Proposed Amendments to the By-Laws**

These proposed amendments to our By Laws were approved by the Board of Directors at their meeting of August 8 and were presented to the General Membership at our most recent meeting of September 19. They are reprinted here for your information and review prior to being voted upon at our next General Meeting of October 17.

**ARTICLE III – MEETINGS, SECTION 5 – SPECIAL MEETINGS**

A new Paragraph D to read as follows:

D. When a vote is required at a properly called Special Meeting, voting shall be in person, or by absentee ballot, either mailed or hand delivered or electronic, as outlined in ARTICLE VII – COMMITTEES, SECTION 18 – ELECTION COMMITTEE, Paragraph B.

**ARTICLE VII – COMMITTEES, SECTION 18 – ELECTION COMMITTEE, Paragraph B**

*which now reads as follows:*

B. Voting shall be in person; however , any member who is otherwise eligible to vote, but cannot do so in person due to absence, illness, employment or for any other legitimate reason, must personally obtain a ballot from the Chair of the Election Committee prior to the annual meeting and be allowed to vote by absentee ballot. The voter shall place the completed ballot in

an individually sealed envelope, complete and sign the statement giving the reason for the absence on the outside of this envelope as provided, place that envelope into another envelope, and send it by United States mail, or deliver it by hand to the Yacht Club addressed to the Chair of the Election Committee so as to arrive at the Yacht Club no later than the day before the election. The outer envelope is to be opened only in the presence of the Committee after the polls have closed on election-day. The legitimacy of the reason for the absence must be approved by a majority of the Election Committee before the ballot can be counted. If the explanation is not accepted by a majority of the Committee, the envelope with the unopened ballot will be so marked and set aside.

*Would be amended to read as follows:*

B. Voting shall be in person; however, any member who is otherwise eligible to vote, but cannot do so in person due to absence, illness, employment or for any other legitimate reason, must personally obtain a ballot from the Chair of the Election Committee prior to the annual meeting and be allowed to vote by absentee ballot. The voter shall place the completed ballot in an individually sealed envelope, complete and sign the statement giving the reason for the absence on the outside of this envelope as provided, place that envelope into another envelope, and send it by United States mail, or deliver it by hand to the Yacht Club addressed to the Chair of the Election Committee so as to arrive at the Yacht Club no later than the day before the election. The outer envelope is to be opened only in



Committee after the polls have closed on election-day. **Absentee ballots may also be completed via electronic mail.** The legitimacy of the reason for the absence must be approved by a majority of the Election Committee before the ballot (**whether mailed, hand delivered or sent electronically**) can be counted. If the explanation is not accepted by a majority of the Committee, the envelope with the unopened ballot will be so marked and set aside.

#### **ARTICLE VII – FINANCES, SECTION 2 – DISBURSEMENT**

*Which now reads as follows:*

Upon approval of the budget, the Treasurer is authorized to make disbursements on accounts and expenses provided for in the budget without additional approval of the Board of Directors. Approval of the Board of Directors shall be obtained for disbursement on accounts and expenses which were not provided for within the budget. All disbursements shall be by check. Any single capital expenditure of more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000) must be approved by the general membership.

*Would be amended to read as follows:*

Upon approval of the budget, the Treasurer is authorized to make disbursements on accounts and expenses provided for in the budget without additional approval of the Board of Directors. Approval of the Board of Directors shall be obtained for disbursement on accounts and expenses which were not provided for within the budget. All disbursements shall be by check **or electronic bill pay.** Any single capital expenditure of more than **ten thousand dollars (\$10,000)** must be approved by the general membership.

Earlier this year you received a letter from George Rhodes asking for your permission, by a vote, to use a sailboat as the logo for the club. This logo was to be used in addition to our burgee and would not replace the burgee that was filed with Lloyds' of London when we applied for our charter as a yacht club.

Please bear with me as I give you a little back ground that I hope qualifies me as someone who knows something about yacht clubs. I served as Commodore of Saylorville Yacht Club located near Des Moines Iowa. Upon retiring to Florida Jeanette and I joined Gulf Harbors Yacht Club and Clearwater Yacht Club. Clearwater is a member of the Florida Council of Yacht Clubs which gave us the privilege to dock our sailboat and visit most Florida Clubs. Shortly there after I was sworn in as your Commodore and served for two years and three months. I have held every office in the club



except secretary and I have chaired every committee except Galley. That was Jeanette's territory. After completing my term as Commodore I was invited to join the International Order of the Blue Gavel. I was soon elected as Secretary of District 8. (The entire state of Florida.) 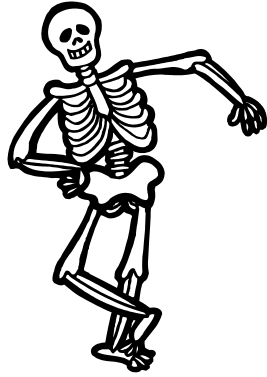

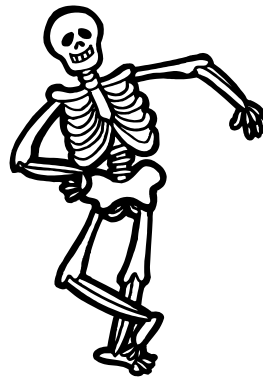
